The Bini Fund supports the community through scholarships, emergency grants and special needs assistance. The fund is uniquely positioned to adapt to the changing needs of communities, especially in times of crisis.

The Bini Fund prides itself on being a 'reactive' organization, which allows us to provide assistance to our community when it needs it most no matter what the tragedy or hardship may be. Some examples of our efforts include the following:

HURRICANE SANDY

In the wake of Super Storm Sandy the organization provided \$125,000 in immiediate needs gift cards, spearheded rebuilding efforts, hosted events nationwide to garner funding for the community, and received support from the likes of NFL Legend Jerry Rice, singer John Mayer, and media coverage ranging from The Daily Show with Jon Stewart to FOX 5 News and WCBS Radio. The organization also partnered with Catholic Charities of NYC and opened Carl's House, which funneled more than \$2.1 million in aid back into the Staten Island Community.

HEART 4 JAKE

The Bini Fund worked hand in hand with a family whose 20-month old son was in need of a heart transplant. Over the course of several months, the campaign was given national attention, and the child received a heart transplant.

BINI BASKETBALL LEAGUE

The organization stepped in to fund a youth basketball league when it learned that Nike pulled its funding after 10 years. The program serviced more than 500 girls and boys on Staten Island each summer.

P.S. 37 RENOVATION

P.S. 37 is a Staten Island school servicing special needs children. The Bini Fund lead a \$35,000 transformation of the school's cafeteria to better suite the needs of these students.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Since its inception, the organization has allocated more than \$300,000 in scholarships to the local community. In addition to scholarships, the Bini Fund has distributed upwards of \$100,000 in immediate needs assistance grants to those in need on Staten Island.

CARL'S HOUSE

In 2016 when Staten Island was considered the epicenter of an opiod epdidemic sweepring the nation, The Bini Fund launched Carl's House, a free community resource center dedicated to bridging the gap between addiction and recovery. The program helped thousands of Staten Islanders, both addicts and their familes, receive the help they needed to combat the disease.

Community Events

Our organization's primary fundraising efforts revolve around community events. In the past, The Bini Fund worked with the Borough President's Office to produce its Annual Back to the Beach Events, and also hosted the island's largest public fundraising events with its Bikers For Bini Series at the Staten Island Mall. Currently, our event lineup includes our Annual Golf Outing, Exotic Food Night, and Bini Bash. These events allow us to raise both funding and awareness so that we can react immiediately to the needs of our community.

EDUCATING FUTURE GENERATIONS

The Carl V. Bini Memorial Fund owns a piece of history, the original Rescue 5 Fire Truck which was decommissioned after the tragic events of 9/11. The truck enables us to educate future generations about an event that altered our nation's history by showcasing it as a mobile musuem.
